

Events of the month

A 1924 Rolls-Royce 20 hp, Barker Tourer (GLK 21) from the Vintage and Classic Car Collection, Udaipur wins Best of Class Category, Vintage Classic in the Cartier Travel with Style Concours

The Cartier 'Travel with Style' Concours is positioned to join the world's top Concours events, alongside the Concorso d'Eleganza held at The Villa d'Este, the Pebble Beach, Concours D'Elegance in California, and the Goodwood Festival of Speed Cartier 'Style et Luxe'. Over the weekend of 31st October to 2nd November 2008, the Royal Western India Turf Club in Mumbai hosted the Cartier 'Travel With Style' Concours. This magnificent display of automobiles, owned by Indian royalty and private collectors, was exhibited on an international stage for the first time with many of the cars participating in the event never having been seen before in India.

Concours d' Elegance' is an exclusive international contest, not about racing power or speed but where invited participants display their vintage and classic cars. Convened for the first time in India this year the 65 cars on display were each unique and extraordinary.

During the time of the Raj, India's affluent ruling families bought the finest cars and the greatest coach builders and designers were specially commissioned to produce lavish, distinctive and sometimes bizarre specification to satisfy the taste of their fabulously rich clients

The Vintage and Classic Car Collection, Garden Hotel, Udaipur selected two cars from their collection to participate in the two main award categories, Best of Show and Best of Class (in four categories): Vintage classic; Post war Classic; Roadster and Exotic.

In the Best of Class Category, Vintage Classic, the 1924 Rolls-Royce 20 hp, Barker Tourer (GLK 21) from the Vintage and Classic Car Collection was proclaimed the winner. This distinguished automobile was awarded the prestigious honour of first prize fulfilling and even exceeding the winning parameters of authenticity and originality, its hand tools, original manuals and dossier. were those who worked on the restoration work on the cars. Mr. Anu Vikram Singh — Assistant Manager, The Palace Motor Garage Workshop and The Vintage and Classic Car Collection, Mr. Surendra Singh, Mr. Rajendra Singh, Mr. Manoj Sen, and Mr. Mohanlal.

In the Best of Class Exotic Category, a 1934 Rolls - Royce 20-25 hp (GKC 10) originally Thrupp & Maberly, Limousine competed.

Manvendra Singh Barwani, India's most respected and experienced classic car expert, had personally selected the 64 cars on display. The judges' panel included HRH Prince Michael of Kent GCVO, Lord March, Sir Anthony Bamford, Nick Mason, Imran Khan, Monica Bellucci and Sophie Marceau. Orchestrating the event was HRH The Duchess of Cornwall's brother, travel writer and conservationist Mark Shand.

Mr. Mark Shand told the audience, "This event will rank alongside other world-renowned Concours and will put India on the International Classic Car circuit. The Cartier 'Travel with Style' Concours will become a bi-annual event including participants from all over the country eventually. The event is not focused solely on displaying cars that are exotic, but will focus on encouraging preservation as well. In a few years time, you may even find a very original Maruti 800 that has been maintained and preserved extraordinarily well in its original form."
